## *A Short Commentary on the Ten Commandments*

Following are the commandments in elemental, contemporary English:

1. Worship only me, YHWH
2. Do not fashion (or worship) a graven image
3. Do not swear or invoke my name as a curse
4. Observe the Sabbath and keep it holy
5. Honor your mother and father
6. Do not kill
7. Be faithful to your spouse
8. Do not steal
9. Do not bear false witness
10. Do not covet.

In a few weeks, I plan to present a sermon series on the commandments and their importance. As you may have gathered by now, I am a "Walk the Talk" Christian. Saying one thing for public consumption to make ourselves look good, but then out of sight and earshot, doing just the opposite is the epitome of deceit. We all know such persons and history is replete with them.

John Chrysostom, 4th century Archbishop of Constantinople, and one of the "Fathers" of the early church, as a young man had been an understudy to a very influential bishop in Antioch who was renown for delivering spellbinding sermons. However, he was a "Do as I say, not as I do" bishop, and lived a dissolute personal life. One Sunday, after a particularly good sermon, the bishop asked

John, "Well, young man, what did you think of my message this morning?" John, summoning up his courage—for it could have meant the end of his calling as a priest, replied: 'Bishop, who you are and what you do speaks so loudly I frankly didn't hear a word of what you said.'

Ralph Waldo Emerson, 15 centuries later—whether knowingly or not, echoed those very same words: "What you are shouts so loudly in my ears I cannot hear what you say."

A businessman well known for his ruthlessness once announced to writer Mark Twain, "Before I die I mean to make a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. I will climb Mount Sinai and read the 10 Commandments aloud at the top." "I have a better idea," replied Twain. "You could stay in Boston and keep them." (Moody Bible Institute's Today in the Word, September, 1991, p. 32.)

Let us remember the context of when and how those commandments were presented to the Israelites.

"On the third new moon after the people of Israel had gone forth out of the land of Egypt..." they camped before Mt. Sinai. God called out to Moses and summoned him to the mountaintop where He verbally communicated the commandments and other detailed instructions of the new

covenant between Him and the Israelites. Moses was summoned there a 2nd time where he remained for 40 days. God etched the commandments on two stone tablets, which Moses brought down—but seeing that the people were worshiping a golden calf, he destroyed the tablets in wrathful anger. That day 3,000 men were slain for breaking the commandment prohibiting graven images. (The whole account is in Exodus: Chapters 19-35)

*Why did Moses go up Mount Sinai twice?* The Middle Eastern practice of dual proceedings in reaching important deals, agreements or covenants may provide an explanation. The giving of the Torah to Israel on Mount Sinai, whether oral or written, was the most momentous event in the Jewish people's history. The once-wandering Israelite tribe, that had just escaped from Egypt, created, under the leadership of Moses a new kind of society. Josephus, in the first century CE, defined this as a "theocracy," or "placing all sovereignty in the hands of God." Centuries later, our [Jewish] sages understood this as "taking on the yoke of the Kingdom of Heaven" (Berachot 2, 2). The text of the principles and laws of the

newly created nation was deposited in the specially prepared and decorated Holy Ark." (Source: Alexander Zvielli, Jerusalem Post, July 17, 2019)

*Why are the Ten Commandments important?* They form the ethical and moral bedrock of Western civilization and are at the core of both Judaism and Christianity. Remember these words of Jesus regarding the Law of Moses (TORAH: the first 5 books of the Hebrew Bible), "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfill. For truly I tell you, until Heaven and Earth pass away, not one letter, not one stroke of a letter, will pass from the law until all is accomplished. Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches others to do the same, will be called least in the Kingdom of Heaven; but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the Kingdom of Heaven." -Matthew 5: 17-19

Keeping the commandments is one of our keys to the Kingdom of God....

Keep the Faith and never forget, no matter what, God loves you.



## Back to School



We are happy to partner with this group who cares so much for our youth.




The Mission is simple. Alleviate and prevent hunger and homelessness.

Preventing hunger and homelessness since 1989, Charlotte County Homeless Coalition assists individuals and families in need of food and shelter. The Homeless Coalition's Hunger Prevention Program is based on the philosophy that no one in our community should go to bed hungry. To meet this goal, they offer both hot meals, lunches, and snacks to the children and access to a weekly Food Pantry.

The Hot Meals Program is open 365 days per year and serves breakfast and lunch to Shelter residents and Veterans in the Shelter, and dinner to the general public in the Homeless Coalition's dining room, as well as evening snacks to the shelter's children. Over the last year, the Hot Meals Program has served more than 75,000 hot meals and snacks.

Volunteers are the backbone of the day-to-day operations and programs & services at The Homeless Coalition. Our volunteers put in several hours a week, in various positions, performing numerous tasks and building fulfilling friendships.

The Homeless Coalition offers Hot Meals every evening from 5:00pm to 6:00pm all year. On Fridays these meals are restaurant style. With ordering from menus and having a waitstaff bring those eating their meals. On the 3rd and 5th Fridays of each month, Pilgrim Church volunteers serve as the waitstaff. We meet at the Homeless Coalition at 4:30 pm.

# Keep The Lights On

The church has incurred a small deficit for the six month period ending June of \$8,264. You may recall we budgeted an annual deficit of \$23,200. Things would appear to be consistent with the budget, but we are entering the 3 most difficult months for pledges and loose collections. Pledge payments are below budget by \$5,919. Joyful Noise continues to be in a surplus position of \$31,250 after debt service despite a drop-off in enrollment after the end of the school year in May.

Keeping The Lights On. This will become the new name of this monthly article. Pilgrim has a total budget of \$309,700. Of this amount, the church requires \$236,000 in pledges to just "keep the lights on". That means all of our fixed expenses of salaries, electricity, insurance, etc. must be paid before we can do any programming. So it is important to meet our pledge obligations, which this year are \$225,000 in the budget, and be thankful for loose collections and other opportunities. Just keeping the lights on is not good enough.
