


September 2020 NEWSLETTER

In person worship resumes

Sunday, September 20, 9:00 am

- We will only use the main Narthex Doors for entering and exiting of the Sanctuary.
- We will have hand sanitizer by the door for you as you enter and leave.
- Temperatures will be checked.
- We will have ushers to seat you with appropriate social distancing. Those traveling together will sit together.
- All staff and volunteers will wear masks.
- All other attendees will wear masks inside the buildings (we have disposable



masks available for those who arrive without their own).

- We will discourage all physical contact (handshakes, hugs, and high-fives).
 - There will be children's Sunday School, they will follow the guidelines the Department of Health has posted.
 - Bulletins will continue to be available online. They will not be printed and handed out on Sunday mornings.
- We will not pass offering plates, instead, we encourage your continued giving to be placed in a designated tithe box, given online at pilgrimonline.org, or mailed to the church.
- The sanctuary will be cleaned and disinfected after each Sunday.

As I mentioned in Sunday's special service the General Council has decided to try to start regular in person services at Pilgrim again starting **September 20th at 9:00 am**. The service will also be available on our website. A word of caution, however; we continue to be concerned about the COVID virus and may have to take action if the infection rate starts to rise again.

As before the following restrictions will apply for you to attend in person services at Pilgrim

Church and we will abide by the following safety protocols:

- Social distancing will be enforced within the buildings. This means that there will be seating restrictions.
- You will be required to wear a face mask at all times. (We will have them available if you forget.)
- Temperatures will be taken at the door.
- Please enter through the front door only.
- Please sit in the pews/seats that the usher directs you.
- If you arrive with family or a couple of friends you can sit together.
- There will be no singing by the Congregation during the service.
- An offering plate will not be passed.
 Instead there will be an offering Box clearly marked for your donations.
- Remember virtual hugs only.

Thank you for your patience in this somewhat trying time. Looking forward to seeing you all again even if it is at a distance.

Words

The old saying "sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me," is a myth. Many words today are meant to do violence to a person, to demean them, to demonize them, or to dehumanize them. Words that use to simply identify someone are now used to discredit the value of a person. Example of two today would be to call a person a Democrat or a Republican with inflammatory qualifications such as liberal or conservative or radical. The way the words are said, with inflections, are intended to denigrate a person's character, or discount their position on issues even to the point of claiming the other to be unAmerican.

I believe that we can see today the power of words to hurt us and tear us down, to do violence to us. However, I also believe that words can be uplifting and healing. Words can bring comfort and encouragement.

Words can reflect our better relationships and foster more affirming attitudes towards others. Such words as love, agape love, forgiveness, justice, and harmony. These words strengthen or relationships, builds up a person, creates harmony among folks, and shows forth valuing a person. Affirming words promotes unity. When I mean by unity is not uniformity. I value diversity which adds joy, and richness to life.

May we today be aware of how we use our words and the meaning they cary behind them. May we seek to affirm others, to build up the community of faith, and to create a loving environment for all. Amen

Reliable help needed for 20 hours a week.

Pilgrim Church of Christ is looking for a part-time handy man/woman for minor facility maintenance. This includes work at the church and our school. Some school maintenance may only be done outside of school hours.

Duties include: setting up tables and chairs for activities, basic repairs as needed including minor plumbing, general painting duties, clearing gutters, and playground maintenance, accessing the attic, and other duties as assigned.

This position has a semi flexible schedule with some work that must be done on Saturdays. This work, overseen by the Parish Administrator and School Director, needs to be done independently and effectively in a timely manner. Pay is negotiable upon experience and performance.

Must be able to: work in varying temperatures, climb ladders to roof heights of buildings on the grounds, bend and stoop, safely lift up to 50lbs, continuously stand, bend, and twist. Must pass drug and background check.

From the Parish Administrator

Hello again, my fellow pilgrims. I hope this finds you well and in good spirits. My deepest thanks go out to our search committee for all of their hard work. It is through them, and the work of our Lord, that we have called a settled pastor to our congregation. Pastor John's message on August 30th was a call for unity and acceptance. I know that I am all in on this message, and pray you will be also. We need to come together and be together in all of our actions and prayers going forward. THIS IS A GREAT TIME TO BE A PILGRIM!!!

There have been several projects going on during the past few months, and there will be more going forward. The entire building has been power washed from top to bottom. It needed it, and it looks very good. We rented a lift in order to clean the vents and the ceiling tiles around the vents in the community center. This lift was also used to fix ceiling damage in the sanctuary.

Beginning next week we are upgrading our security system, including cameras, alarm system, and fire alarm system in both the main church building, community center, and Joyful Noise. This project will take a few weeks to complete but will not affect day to day operations.

Wonderful News: You will soon see a new vehicle parked at Joyful Noise. For several years, we have put monies aside for the replacement of one of the Joyful Noise vans. These vans are used daily to transport students to and from their elementary schools. One of the vans can no longer be used; therefore, we have purchased a fourteen-passenger bus.

Finally, we have contracted to have some building repairs done to the exterior of Joyful Noise, and that will be completed soon.

A word about re-opening on September 20th: MASKS!!! Yes, masks are required to be present in the congregation. I know that some have difficulty wearing a mask, but please remember that it isn't all about you. Masks protect others around you, so please be considerate of yourself and others by wearing a mask.

Finally, I was very inspired by Pastor John's presence on Sunday. Message aside, the event brought people back into the sanctuary, a sight that has eluded us for several months. I wish to thank all of you who have been diligent in your giving of gifts and tithes during this time and urge you to maintain, or increase, your faith commitment as we look ahead to beginning anew with Pastor John. My journey as a pilgrim, walking with Jesus, continues.

From the Desk of Reverend Bill

Greetings to the Pilgrim family,

Yesterday, August 30, this congregation took the historic step of extending a call to Pastor John to serve as your next Senior Pastor. The enthusiasm of attendees that I witnessed following the service lets me know that though this has been a long process, God's Spirit has been alive through it all.

The arrival of a new pastor is an awesome time for any congregation, as new relationships, new ideas and new traditions emerge to develop meaningful ministries built upon the existing foundations. As Pastor John said in his sermon, everyone, pastor and lay member alike, have diverse gifts and talents that when used together, will develop more fully the Body of Christ at Pilgrim Church.

His arrival means that my time with the Pilgrim family is nearing an end. The church leadership and I have joked often this summer that when they asked me to provide worship leadership, way back in February, it was only going to be for two Sundays! Six months later, I feel very much like a part of the Pilgrim family. And that has led me to think a bit about the whole concept of "family" especially as it is used in the life of a congregation.

We may be 'born' into a family. But we can also be 'adopted' into a family or even 'assimilated' into one. I know that I was born into my biological family, and that I have nephews and a niece who were adopted into our family and have become family, even as they have come to know of the families into which they were born. I can also recall the very good friends that our family grew up with who became so close that many times my siblings and their sons thought we had four parents, so assimilated we were into both families.

There are also some marvelous families who open their homes, their arms and their love to welcome an unrelated person into the family as they 'foster' that new addition.

I was born into the United Church of Christ through my heritage, and I was adopted into the life of congregations in Wisconsin and Florida for 45 years as they called me to pastoral leadership. While serving those congregations, I became assimilated into many families by sharing the most intimate experiences of life: birth, death, marriage, struggles.

In the past six months I have now experienced what it means to be fostered by a family – the Pilgrim Church family – as I have lived through perhaps one of the most profound times many of us have experienced. You have welcomed me into your homes via remote worship, you have sent emails and cards of appreciation which have humbled me, you have embraced me in those times when we may have met outside the sanctuary. I feel as if I have gained a temporary family who has nurtured me in these days, allowing me to enjoy the weekly task of preaching again, if only for a short time (or a very long two weeks!).

As October dawns, a new chapter of Pilgrim's life will begin. You will be well served. You will welcome Pastor John's family into the history and the future of this congregation. You will honor the church family into which they were born, adopt them into Pilgrim life, and assimilate them into your special life events. Love them, and let them be themselves, using their unique and diverse gifts and talents in your common ministry.

Until that time, I will still see you in worship, remotely for the first two weeks, and then with great hope (and continued good health numbers), we will once again gather, physically distanced and masked, in the sanctuary for the last two Sundays. And God's Spirit will continue to be present with us however and wherever we come together to praise God.

My deepest thanks for the opportunity that you have given me to share in the ministry and family of Pilgrim Church.
